We're Upgrading Your Facilities

In 2015, the City of Boise studied the option of closing the Lander Street Water Renewal Facility (facility) and consolidating water treatment elsewhere. The study concluded that the benefits outweighed the costs of keeping the facility open.

To meet future needs, permit requirements, and replace aging infrastructure, the City of Boise is beginning the process of planning, designing, and constructing improvements to the Lander Street facility.




Why is this project important?

- Meet current and future regulations for the release of water into the Boise River
- Reduce the amount of phosphorus reaching the Boise River
- The facility was built in 1948 and treats 10 to 12 million gallons of wastewater each day.
- Future needs will require the facility treat 15 to 17 million gallons each day.



Why are water renewal services important?

- Protect public health and the environment
- Ensure water quality of the Boise River
- Provide infrastructure and capacity for economic development

How is this Project part of the bigger picture?

- The City of Boise is in the process of developing a 30-year plan that will guide decisions and investments for managing Boise water renewal services. Boise operates and maintains a \$2 billion water collection, treatment, and disposal system:
 - 925 miles of collection pipe
 - 25 pump stations
 - Two water renewal facilities: West Boise and Lander Street
 - Dixie Drain Phosphorus Removal Facility
 - Twenty Mile South Farm (biosolids land application site)
